Nigorigo Onsen

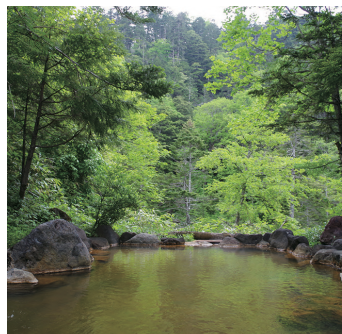

Closed for the winter season.

Surrounded by forest, this open-air bath offers the perfect hidden retreat. With only outdoor tubs, it boasts a wild charm where Japanese serows and wild squirrels occasionally appear. The spring water is also popular for its skin-smoothing and hydrating qualities.

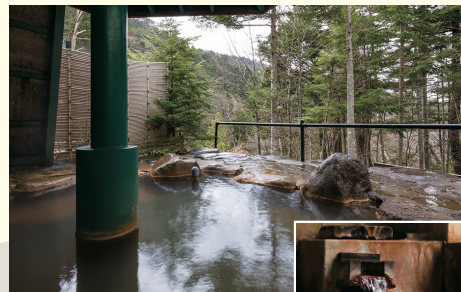


Yunotanisou

Drive Carefully on Narrow Roads

- The road to Nigorigo Onsen, known for its hidden hot springs, is narrow in many areas and can get quite dark at night. Some spots also have no signal, so please be cautious.

Winter and Night Road Closures

- Certain routes may be closed in winter or at night. We recommend traveling with winter tyres and a 4WD vehicle (chains for 2WD vehicles).

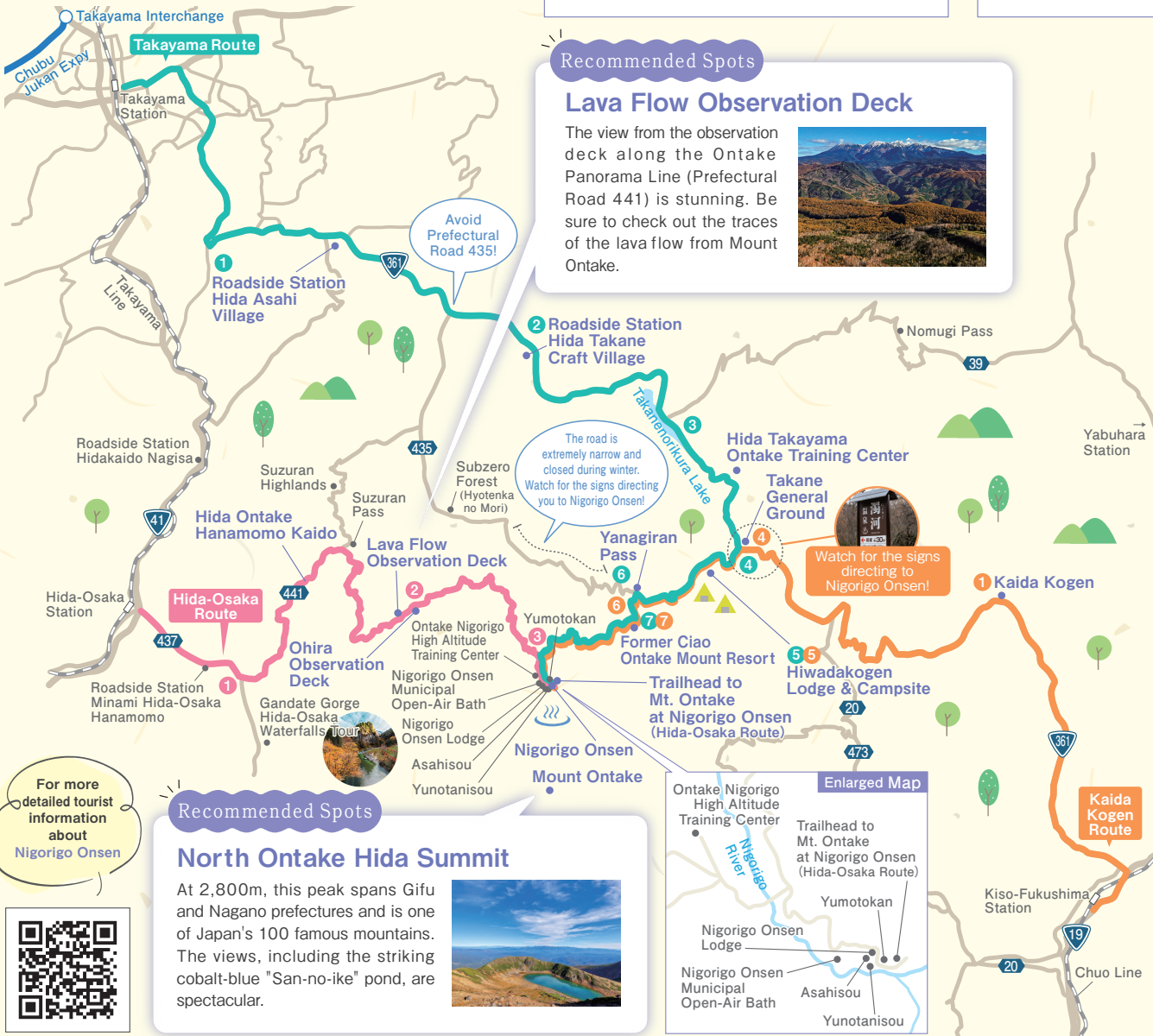
Don't Rely Only on GPS or Map Apps

- Some navigation systems or map apps might direct you along longer or narrower, more hazardous roads. Please check your route in advance to ensure it's safe.

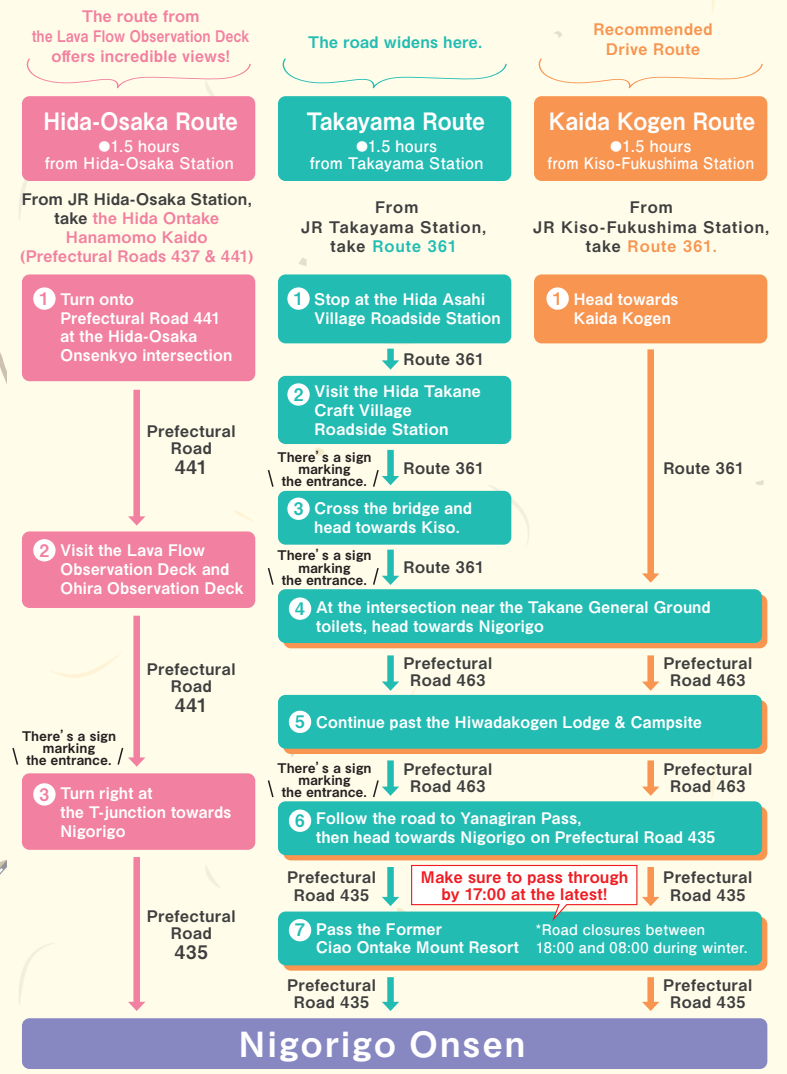
Recommended Spots

Recommended Route to Nigorigo Onsen



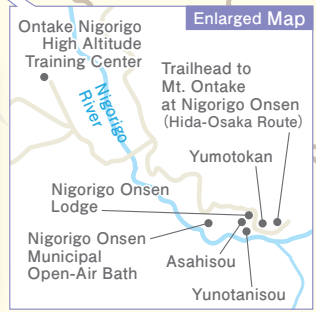

Recommended Spots

North Ontake Hida Summit

At 2,800m, this peak spans Gifu and Nagano prefectures and is one of Japan's 100 famous mountains. The views, including the striking cobalt-blue "San-no-ike" pond, are spectacular.
